Principles of How-to Articles

- These pieces are different from self-help articles in that they typically deal with the physical rather than the emotional or spiritual world.
 - Woodworking
 - Scrapbooking
 - Gardening
- Solving a reader problem, need, or yearning is essential.

What's All This Mean to Me?

If you have a passion for a hobby such as knitting or genealogy, a publication wants your work.

If you have expertise in an area such as making metal jewelry, a publication wants your work.

If you've created an unusual quilting pattern and can explain how to replicate it, a publication wants your work.




Principles of How-to Articles

- The language must be clear and concise—few adjectives and adverbs. Passive voice is even more of a no-no here than in other writing.
- The photos or illustrations that accompany the text are even more important than your words.

Finding Markets for Your Work

- In this field more than in many others, you are likely to be part of your target audience!
